

















ATTENTION ORCA MEMBERS!


The time has come and Barb & Bill Taylor's 4-year term as ORCA State Directors will soon be ending.

We will need to select a new State Director to take over in 2026.

Election Procedures of State Director:

- a. State Director Nomination Forms must be emailed to each Chapter President by September 30th and returned to the State Treasurer emailed no later than October 15th. Any nominations received after that date are null and void. Each Chapter is allowed to nominate up to three people.
- b. The State Treasurer will contact each nominee to see if they will accept the nomination. If yes, then a Qualifications Form will be sent to them and required to be completed. It will need to be returned by October 30th.
- c. The Nomination Announcement will be made through the November Drifter and an announcement sent to the Chapter Presidents by sending the nominee's completed qualifications form to them. The Official Ballot will also be sent at the same time by the Treasurer. All returned ballots need to be postmarked no later than November 30th. Any ballots posted after that date will be considered null and void.
- d. Tallying of the ballots will be done by the State Treasurer. An announcement will be made to the present State Director and the Executive Board and then sent to the Chapter Presidents. The new State Director will be introduced through The Drifter and confirmed at the next State Committee meeting.
- e. If the nominee for State Director is unopposed up to two weeks before the scheduled time for the State Treasurer to send ballots to the Chapter Presidents, the State Treasurer will call the election satisfied. That nominee will automatically be designated the next State Director. Notification of that decision will go out to the Chapter Presidents.
- f. The State Director is elected and takes office on the even numbered year for a two-year term (beginning January 1, 2026).

Dee Veenendaal's name will be added to the nomination form. She has voiced an interest in becoming State Director.
